The Department of the Air Force (DAF), in coordination with the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) and the Wyoming Department of Environmental Quality (WDEQ), is conducting the sixth Five-Year Review at F.E. Warren Air Force Base (FEW), located in Cheyenne, WY (EPA ID# WY5571924179). Environmental remediation actions at FEW are being addressed under the Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation, and Liability Act (CERCLA, also known as Superfund) Section 121. The remedial actions to address environmental contamination at FEW are specified in the various Record of Decisions (RODs) signed by the DAF, the EPA, and the WDEQ that pertain to the 14 Operable Units that together encompass the contaminated sites and groundwater contaminant plumes. The purpose of this Five-Year Review is to ensure that the remedies are functioning as intended and continue to be protective of public health and the environment. A summary of activities and an evaluation of the protectiveness of the

implemented remedies will be included in the Five-Year Review report.

The Five-Year Review cycle is required by Superfund when contaminants remain at a site. The review includes inspection of the site and cleanup technologies; review of monitoring, performance, and maintenance records; and evaluation of any new relevant regulatory requirements that have been established since the cleanup decision was finalized.

This notice invites any interested person to provide written comments and/or to schedule an interview to provide comments. The Five-Year Review report will consider all written comments received during this public comment period ending 13 August 2024. Interview requests must be submitted by 30 July 2024. The final report will be available to the public in February 2025.
